# Message from the Executive Director

Stories are an important part of Happy Trails for Kids. Stories about our history, our program, and our campers help to foster community and provide a window into the organization. For this past summer, our program's most important story was being able to safely offer camp for hundreds of children experiencing foster care. It showed our commitment and resilience to the children we serve, while creating opportunities for children to create their own stories.

Our resolve to deliver on our mission was based on the belief that during the pandemic, too many children had been without joy, nature, friends, and family. We navigated the challenges of the pandemic and were able to safely bring together these missing pieces, creating a celebration of childhood and a refuge to process all that was lost and overcome.

By delivering on camp, we helped our campers create new stories through their profound experiences. Long after the suitcases are packed and camp is over, these camp stories help advance positive changes in the lives of children we serve. All of that is reinforced through year-round engagements and ongoing supportive, educational, and recreational programs.

As an example, I am reminded of three brothers who attended camp. On the last day of camp, they were looking at pictures together in their scrapbooks— already reminiscing over the fun times. Their story this summer was not defined by foster care and the tragedy of being separated and living in different homes. They have a new story to share and build on — and it is one of joy and togetherness.

Each child growing up in foster care has their own story. And, while we cannot remove past chapters, we can help change the narrative. Happy Trails for Kids gives children reasons to celebrate, reminding them that they are resilient, they are important, and they belong. Just as our community of campers relied on Happy Trails this past year, we in turn relied on our community of friends and partners. During very challenging times, our supporters rallied for our cause and for our kids. Thank you so much for being a part of these important stories.

# OUR PROGRAMMING

Our programming extends well beyond camping. Maintaining a consistent and active presence in the lives of the campers is critical to our model. Happy Trails understands that the "extras" in life matter. We carefully select our programming to bring extracurricular experiences into the lives of children experiencing foster care. We hosted 42 educational or recreational reunion events this year.



**Specialized Programs** 

Trails to Success: Programming to help prepare older youth to live accomplished and happy lives, including leadership development, career readiness and individualized outreach and support.

Happy Trails Hangouts: In partnership with Happy Camper Live, campers participate in monthly virtual extracurricular experiences. With exciting guest facilitators and the opportunity to spend time with camp counselors and friends, Hangouts brings children together for fun, safe and accessible extracurricular activities.

Happy Trails Tutors: Weekly tutoring sessions and academic support for children. Our incredible tutors provided nearly 15,000 hours of tutoring in 2021.

Mobile Photo Lab: Too often children growing up in foster care report an absence of childhood photos. The Photo Lab project ensures campers not only leave camp with a scrapbook of camp memories, but a documentation of their life experiences and friendships.

**Hoof to Heart:** An equine education and exploration program designed to help children foster an appreciation to horses and benefit from the therapeutic experience connected to these majestic animals.






