

Camp

Thanks to our incredible staff, partners, supporters, and most importantly, CAMPERS, Happy Trails brought the magic of summer camp to over 300 children growing up in foster care. Our camp theme this year was "You have a Friend in Me" – which really goes to the heart of our program...friendship, laughter, community, adventure and fun for children in foster care.

I often think of the camper who told me that before she discovered Happy Trails, she dreaded returning to school in the fall. Teachers and other kids would ask her what she did over the summer....and she had nothing to share. Now, she can't wait to share about Happy Trails and all of the new experiences she has at camp. She sings her favorite camp songs and talks about what it was like to ride a horse for the first time, or take a night swim in a lake, or ride a zip line down a mountain in Big Bear.

Camp is an experienced-based intervention. Campers draw on their experiences at camp to help navigate their everyday lives; to find comfort in the connections made with friends and counselors when loneliness or uncertainty emerges; to demonstrate confidence when facing a new challenge or opportunity and to remind themselves that they matter and are loved.

OUR PROGRAMMING

Campers never have to pack their bags at Happy Trails for Kids. Our model of year-round engagement is intentional and impactful. With our reunion events, youth have opportunities to strengthen their relationships while exploring new paths, learning new skills, or simply having a fun weekend together. In 2022, Happy Trails for Kids hosted 36 educational or recreational reunion events.



Specialized Programs

Trails to Success: Programming to help prepare older youth to live accomplished and happy lives, including leadership development, career readiness and individualized outreach and support.

Happy Trails Hangouts: In partnership with Happy Camper Live, campers participate in monthly virtual extracurricular experiences. With exciting guest facilitators and the opportunity to spend time with camp counselors and friends, Hangouts brings children together for fun, safe and accessible extracurricular activities.

Mobile Photo Lab: Too often children growing up in foster care report an absence of childhood photos. The Photo Lab project ensures campers not only leave camp with a scrapbook of camp memories, but a documentation of their life experiences and friendships.

Hoof to Heart: An equine education and exploration program designed to help children foster an appreciation to horses and benefit from the therapeutic experience connected to these majestic animals.






